LOOK Alike & SOUND Alike

[LASA] medications are medications that have similar visual in packaging or appearance or having similar spelling of names or phonetics. This may lead to potentially harmful medication errors. Therefore, identification, periodic review of LASA medications in the medication storage areas are needed to minimise unintentional medication errors during times where these could be overlooked.

TIPS #1 to avoid LASA errors: Do not rely on familiarity, visual recognition or common location. Always READ generic name, READ brand names, READ label, READ Prescription, and RE-READ again.

TIPS #2 to avoid LASA errors: Minimize the use of verbal and phone orders.







TIPS #3 to avoid LASA errors: Store problem medications in separate locations or in non-alphabetical order, such as by bin number.
